

Guide for Parents-What you need to know about AP Courses 2019-2020

AP gives students the chance to tackle college-level work while they're still in high school and earn college credit and placement. - Your child will create a collegeboard account in their AP class unless they already have one. This will allow them access to resources that a teacher can assign, the ability to learn more about college requirements, and after taking the test, the ability to retrieve their scores and share them with colleges.
- NEW THIS YEAR: Students must commit to taking or not taking the test by November 1st, 2019.
- The AP Exam Fee is \$94 per test. If a student qualifies for Free/Reduced Lunch, please contact Tracy Deavers at tracy.deavers@edgerton.k12.wi.us for more information.
- Payment for an AP Test is due by November 1st, 2019. If you need additional time, please contact Tracy Deavers at tracy.deavers@edgerton.k12.wi.us. Payment can be done with your Infinite Campus portal or by delivering a check to Mary Hays in the High School Office.
- If your student decides to take the exam after November 1st, an additional fee of \$40 will be charged to you. (total cost per exam increases to \$134)
- If your student decides to cancel an exam prior to March 1st, 2020, you would only pay \$40 for the cancellation fee. You would not be charged the \$94 exam fee or if you already paid that, it would be refunded to you.
- If your student commits to taking a test but decides not to take the test after March 1st, 2020, the \$94 will not be refunded.
- AP Classes are RIGOROUS. Your student will have to spend more time on this class than others. Teachers have required content to get through in a short amount of time so please encourage your student to stay on top of the work.
