Not Tested <u>Without</u> an Alternate Diagnosis Follow COVID-19 Symptom Criteria: One symptom of cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, loss of taste and/or smell; OR Two symptoms of fever or chills, muscle aches or body aches, headache, sore throat, fatigue, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea	<p>May return to school after:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At least 5 days have passed from the date symptoms began AND • 24 hours fever-free without the use of fever-reducing medications AND • Improvement of symptoms 	N/A

Close Contact has occurred if any of the following situations happened while an individual spent time with the person with a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19, even if the person did not have symptoms during their infectious period:

- Had direct contact with the person; **OR**
- Had contact with the person’s respiratory secretions, **OR**
- Lives with or stayed overnight with the person, **OR**
- Were within 6 feet of the person for more than 15 minutes

EXCEPTION: In the K-12 indoor classroom setting, the close contact definition excludes students who were **within 3 to 6 feet** of an infected student if both students were consistently wearing well-fitted masks.

NOTE: Exception DOES NOT apply to teachers, staff and other adults in the classroom setting.

<p>The following close contacts should quarantine for 5 days after last contact with the positive individual. On day 6-10 discontinue quarantine and continue wearing a well-fitted mask around others through day 10:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You are ages 18 or older and completed the primary series of recommended vaccine but have not received a recommended booster shot when available. You received the single dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine over 2 months ago and have not received a recommended booster shot. You are not vaccinated or have not completed a primary vaccine series. 	<p>If you are a close contact and symptomatic, get tested as soon as possible and isolate until test results are received.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If positive, follow the above guidance for Tested and Positive. If negative, continue quarantine for 5 days from last contact or until illness symptoms improve (whichever is later). 	<p>If you are a close contact and do not have symptoms:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continue to quarantine through 5 days from last contact of the positive individual. Monitor for symptoms of illness for 10 days from last contact with the positive person. Get tested at least 5 days after your last contact with the positive individual. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If you test positive refer to tested and positive guidance above
<p>The following close contacts Do Not Need to quarantine, however, should wear a well-fitting mask around others for 10 days from the date of your last close contact with the positive individual.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You are ages 18 or older and have received all recommended vaccine doses, including boosters and additional primary shots for some immunocompromised people. You are ages 5 -17 and completed the primary series of COVID-19 vaccines. You had a confirmed COVID-19 infection within the last 90 days (you tested positive using a viral test). 	<p>If you are a close contact, are symptomatic and are not recommended to quarantine based on vaccination guidance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Isolate and get tested. Remain in isolation until notified of test results, then follow the guidance above <i>Tested and Negative or Tested and Positive.</i> 	<p>Wear a well-fitting mask around others for 10 days from the date of your last close contact with someone who is positive for COVID-19 infection.</p> <p>Get tested at least 5 days after you last had close contact with someone with COVID-19.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If you test positive refer to tested and positive guidance above
